



Professor Samuel M. **WANGWE** is the CHAIRMAN of The Commission.

He also serves as Chairman of Daima Associates Limited (DAIMA), a private consulting firm based in Dar es Salaam that offers a range of professional services directed towards the economic management and policy analysis. He was the policy advisor on coordination of reforms in the Office of the President- Public Service Management, a post he took after eight years as Executive Director of the Economic and Social Research Foundation (ESRF) a non-profit nongovernmental policy research institute focusing on capacity building in economic and social policy and development management in Tanzania. He led REPOA a policy think tanks for 5 years from 2011-2015 after which he re-joined Daima Associates. He is principal research associate with ESRF and REPOA.

Professor Wangwe holds a Ph.D. in Economics (1980), MA in Economics (1973) and BA in Economics and Statistics (1972) from the University of Dar es Salaam; and has also worked as the head of the Department of Economics as well as dean of the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences at the same university. During a three-year leave of absence from the University, he was senior research fellow at the Institute for New Technologies of the United Nations University in Maastricht, The Netherlands.

He has published 13 books, over 70 articles in scholarly journals and over 200 consultancy assignments in the areas of social accounting, economic policy reforms, labour and rural poverty, industrial development, development strategies, foreign aid, capacity building, trade, regional integration and globalization and technology, and development of specific sectors such as mining and energy; health, education and partnerships in development; and human and institutional capacity building. He has served on a number of advisory boards including the Bank of Tanzania, the Tanzania Housing Bank, and the National Micro Finance Bank and has

chaired several boards including the State Mining Corporation, the National Institute of Productivity, the National Social Security Fund in Tanzania and is currently chairing the Social Action Trust Fund and the Kibaha Education Centre in Tanzania.

He has also been a member of several commissions, special committees, and task forces including the Fourth Five Development Plan Working Committee on Industry and Technology; the Committee for Improving National Statistics; the Secretariat of the Tanzania Advisory Group; the Presidential Commissions on Exports and Salaries; the Tax Force on Restructuring the National Bank of Commerce; the Advisory Committee in Financial Sector Reform, and was Chairperson of the national Consultative Committee on Fast Tracking the East African Federation.
